Founding and Beginnings

RDA was founded in 1975 by Lady MacLehose, wife of the then Governor of Hong Kong, Mrs. Binkie Leader and Mrs. Jill James. The first sessions took place at The Hong Kong Jockey Club's Riding School in Beas River. In the following years, RDA expanded operations to the HKJC Pokfulam Public Riding School, laying the foundation for therapeutic riding in Hong Kong.




1980s

Growth and Community Support

RDA's operation started to flourish with the arrival of new ponies generously donated by corporations and charitable organizations. The number of riders and volunteers increased steadily, enabling RDA to offer regular therapeutic riding sessions and strengthening its role in the community.

Expansion and Professional Development

RDA began operations at the HKJC Tuen Mun Public Riding School and introduced structured training and accreditation system for volunteers. Drawing from international standards in Australia and the UK, RDA also incorporated advice from physiotherapist from the UK into our therapeutic riding lessons.



2000s

From Rehabilitation to Sports

RDA expanded its service from pure therapeutic riding to also support the development of para equestrian sports. Hong Kong athletes began participating in international competitions, with the first rider representing Hong Kong at the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games.

RDA launched its first research symposium in 2005, publishing the RDA Survey and Marketing Study to better understand the market needs from the disabled community in Hong Kong.

Advancing Para Equestrian Sports

Building on our Paralympic success in 2008, RDA formed a Para Equestrian Squad, which made its debut at the Taiwan Hope Cup in 2010. To support athletes in achieving international qualifications, RDA hosted Hong Kong's first CPEDI3* Para Equestrian International Competition in 2011. Hong Kong para riders were proudly represented at the 2014 World Equestrian Games and three consecutive Paralympic Games from 2012 to 2020.



RDA through evolving times. Their vision, leadership, and resilience have been key to RDA's growth from a grassroots initiative to a structured and impactful charity.





potential through RDA and progressed to elite training. These athletes are a testament to the programme's ability to empower and inspire, turning challenges into opportunities for excellence.

Ms. Natasha Tse

Natasha was born at twenty-nine weeks and diagnosed by her pediatrician with congenital cerebral palsy. Natasha experienced a turning point in her life when she joined RDA at the age of five. Eventually, Natasha became a member of the RDA Para Equestrian Squad. In 2012, Natasha was selected to represent Hong Kong as a Para Equestrian Athlete at the London Paralympic Games at the age of just fifteen years old. She subsequently competed in the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Paralympic Games, the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games and the 2024 Paris Paralympic Games, successfully completing the events.



Mr. Timothy Tsang

Timothy was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at a young age. In 2009, an education centre arranged for him to participate in RDA's therapeutic riding programme.

In 2011, Timothy became a member of the RDA Para Equestrian Squad and took part in his first international competition.

In recent years, Timothy has participated in many international competitions including the 2014 and 2018 World Equestrian Game held in France and the USA respectively, and the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games.



Ms. Fleur Schrader

Fleur was diagnosed with spina bifida when she was very young, and a few years later her family decided to enroll her into the therapeutic riding programme offered by RDA. Fleur started riding with RDA when she was only seven years old. She has gained many benefits from riding which has improved her physical strength, balance, and self-confidence.

In 2015, Fleur was selected as a member of the RDA Para Equestrian Squad, which led to her taking part in her first international competition in France during the same year. In recent years, Fleur has participated in the 2018 World Equestrian Games in the USA and the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games.



Mr. Louie Lam

Louie was diagnosed with hereditary spastic diplegia. He first joined RDA lesson in July 2015, then progressed to the RDA Para Development Squad.

Louie has been recently qualified as elite sports rider in July 2023.



Ms. Choi Hoi Lam

Hoi Lam was diagnosed with spastic diplegia and she joined the RDA Para Development Squad in February 2018.




Ms. Ai Lik Ka Tara








Ponies


Off to the Races! With Nacho
